New South Wales Gaelic Athletic Association Bye-Laws

1	In order for a player to be eligible to play in a Grand Final for a competition with 7 or more games (including semi finals) each player must have played 3 games in that competition. For competitions with 6 or less round games (including semifinals), each player must have played in 2 or more games in that competition or have played 1 game in said competition and been eligible to play in the grand final of the previous NSW competition (either league or championship)
2	All motions & nominations must be submitted in writing as per due date NSW provide
3	A quorum of 5 committee members must be present for any legal NSW committee meeting, one of which must be the President, Vice-President, Secretary or Treasurer.
4	On the dugout side of the field, all team officials must be clearly identified (i.e. Coach, Manager and two water runners)
5	In the event of a draw in a semi-final or final, 2 x 10 minute periods of extra time will be played. If sides are still level after extra time, a sudden death period of extra time will be played with the match awarded to the team who scores first. A new toss will be held before extra time and sudden death extra time.
6	All frees, penalties, 45's & 65's in hurling, awarded before the hooter should be taken. Any resulting score will be allowed provided the ball does not touch an attacking player in flight. The score will be allowed in both hurling & football if the ball touches the ground and results in a score without being aided by an attacking player.
7	Every person paying to enter the park will be issued with a numbered ticket
8	The Treasurer's Report shall be signed off by an accountant before being presented at the AGM.
9	Every cheque written shall be counter signed by another committee member.
10	A player selected for both hurling & football State teams shall be permitted to play in both competitions at the Australasian Championships.
11	Central Coast hurling & ladies football teams to retain the colours of Black & Amber.
12	Young Irelands football team to retain the colours of Yellow & Green
13	Michael Cusacks GAA club to retain the club colours of Red & White
14	Clan Na Gael GFC to retain the club colours of Maroon & White.
15	Sydney Shamrocks Hurling Club to retain the colours of White & Navy
16	Penrith Gaels football club to retain the colours of White, Green & Yellow.

17	All clubs shall be required to provide referees, lines people and umpires for competitions in which they are participating and shall be liable for a fine for failing to do so.
18	All players are required to present photo ID when registering with the NSW GAA.
19	Cormac McAnallens teams to retain the colours of White, Red and Black
20	Craobh Pádraig teams to retain the colours of Green and Black
21	Any club or member of a club proven guilty of misrepresenting themselves under the name of another NSW GAA club so as to bring that club into disrepute shall be fined a minimum of \$500 and are liable to be suspended from the current competition.
22	Glass bottles are not allowed on the premises/fields of Bob Prenter Reserve (Monarch Fields).
23	A \$10 entry fee shall be charged for all round games and for the league and championship semi-finals and finals. All money generated from gate fees will go directly into the Development Fund except for the gate fees taken at semi-finals and finals which shall go to the General Fund for use in running the Association.
